Allotments Report: The fruit trees in the allotment have been pruned heavily. The list of fruit trees has been updated and will be on the new web-site. One person has downsized to ½ a plot. Plot 16 was dormant last year but will be cultivated again this year. The top of the poplar tree sucker near the manure has been cut down. Cutting the root could be a job for Tuesday/Thursday volunteers. The pruning saw has turned up. Seven of the directors are now allotment holders.	
 Building Team Report: Rob has asked for 3 quotes for water tank covers – aluminium, in two halves with handles. The cost is likely to be around £300 for 3 covers. They will be painted to deter theft. The brambles next to the wall have been removed and black plastic will be laid along the wall. The black poplars in the carpark will be removed and later the pea cage will be removed. Laurel cutting will need to be delayed until early autumn. 	
Wildlife Report : The mixed hedge on the east wall is being trimmed to reduce overhang and shade on the polytunnel. Trevor has been asked to help. The bee slope will now be built opposite the entrance to the southern polytunnel.
